Description and Reasons for Notification:

Duke of York Meadow is an unimproved hay meadow near the eastern edge of the Malvern Hills in Worcestershire. It lies on neutral soils derived from the underlying Keuper Marl. It has been selected as an example of neutral grassland with a significant component of wild daffodil *Narcissus pseudonarcissus* in the sward. Grasses typical of hay meadows are present such as quaking grass *Briza media*, yellow oat-grass *Trisetum flavescens* and meadow foxtail *Alopecurus pratensis*, along with characteristic herbs including devil's-bit scabious *Succisa pratensis*, pepper saxifrage *Silaum silaus* and green-winged orchid *Orchis morio*. Also present is great burnet *Sanguisorba officinalis*, an uncommon plant in Worcestershire.
