1	Cultivation, especially cultivation within tunnels, including mushroom farming.
2	The introduction of grazing and changes in the grazing regime (including type of stock or intensity or seasonal pattern of grazing and cessation of grazing).
3	The introduction of stock feeding and changes in stock feeding practice, including changes in the number of animals stocked, and the feeding or sheltering of stock within tunnels or at their entrances.
4	Changes in the mowing or cutting regime (including hay making to silage and cessation).
5	Application of manure.
6	Application of pesticides, including herbicides (weedkillers).
7	Dumping, spreading or discharge of any materials.
8	Burning.
9	The release into the site of any wild, feral or domestic animal*, plant or seed.
10	The killing or removal of any wild animal*, including pest control.
11	The destruction, displacement, removal or cutting of any shrub or turf.
12	Changes in tree and/or woodland management+.
15	Infilling of pits.
20	Extraction of minerals, including sand and gravel, topsoil, subsoil, chalk, lime and spoil.
21	Construction, removal or destruction of roads, tracks, walls, fences, hardstands, banks, ditches or other earthworks, or the laying, maintenance or removal of pipelines and cables, above or below ground.
22	Storage of materials.
23	Erection of permanent or temporary structures, or the undertaking of engineering works, including drilling.
24	Modification of natural or manmade features (including tunnel entrances), clearance of boulders, large stones, loose rock or scree and battering, buttressing or grading rockfaces and cuttings, infilling of pits and quarries.
25	Removal of geological specimens, including rock samples, minerals and fossils.
26	Use of vehicles or craft likely to damage or disturb bats or features of interest.
27	Recreational or other activities likely to disturb bats or damage features of interest.
28	Changes in game management and hunting practice.

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\* 'animal' includes any mammal, reptile, amphibian, bird, fish or invertebrate.  
+ including afforestation, planting, clear and selective felling, thinning, coppicing, modification of the stand or underwood, changes in species composition, cessation of management.
