2	The introduction of and subsequent changes in the grazing regime (including type of stock, intensity or seasonal pattern of grazing and cessation of grazing).

7	Dumping, spreading or discharge of any materials.

11	The destruction, displacement, removal or cutting of any plant or plant remains, including tree, shrub, herb, dead or decaying wood, moss, lichen, fungus, leaf-mould, turf etc.
12	The introduction of and changes in tree and/or woodland management+.
13a	Drainage (including gripping and the use of mole, tile, tunnel or other artificial drains).
13b	Modification of the structure of watercourses (eg ponds, springs, ditches, dykes, drains), including their banks and beds, as by re-alignment, re-grading and dredging.
14	The changing of water levels and tables and water utilisation (including irrigation, storage and abstraction from existing water bodies and through boreholes).
15	Infilling of ditches, dykes, drains, ponds, pools, marshes or pits.
20	Extraction of minerals, including peat.
21	Construction, removal or destruction of roads, tracks, walls, fences, hardstands, banks, ditches or other earthworks, or the laying, maintenance or removal of pipelines and cables, above or below ground.
23	Erection of permanent or temporary structures, or the undertaking of engineering works, including drilling.
26	Use of vehicles or craft likely to damage or disturb features of interest.
27	Recreational or other activities likely to damage or disturb features of interest.
28	Changes in game and waterfowl management and hunting practice.

* 'animal' includes any mammal, reptile, amphibian, bird, fish or invertebrate.
